Message from the Chair

I got home from the Guildford Diocesan Clergy Conference on Thursday 22 June after three days of hearing about all the things I could do if I had the time or energy, and in the evening arrived at Elstead Church for the Archdeacon's Visitation Service at which churchwardens are admitted only to find the Farncombe churchwardens standing outside a locked church. What had happened is that when setting the dates with them I'd consulted a memo from the Diocese I found in my pending emails and failed to notice that it had last year's date on the top. Then today (Friday) I found myself having to cancel the following morning's Prayer Breakfast because I'd forgotten that the proposed date had never been confirmed with the venue. It's enough to make one feel thoroughly discouraged.

These are just silly mistakes; but occasionally a church tries something and even lays the ground quite carefully for it, yet finds it not working at all. Our winter after-school meals project at St John's was one of these. It seemed like a good concept, and lots of community organisations we consulted agreed, but it met with a very limited response. Coincidentally one of the themes at the Clergy Conference was the interaction between churches and their surrounding communities, and this isn't something which is only relevant to Anglican churches. At the next Churches Together Council on the 17th we'll have a chance to hear about Farncombe Parish Church's experience, and it would be fascinating if our brothers and sisters of other church communities could share thoughts and ideas about their own. And I have booked that event in the diary!
