Message from the Chair

It was good to hear proper acknowledgement in the media of Sinead O'Connor's religion after the singer's death a few days ago. Much of what she did and said was filtered through her own self-admitted craziness, but it was always deeply serious and profoundly meant. I wonder how the Church can manage to deal with prophetic figures like O'Connor who seem to have a vocation to call it to account, to announce to it that all is not well? Perhaps it can't – prophets can't be accommodated or assimilated without ceasing to be what they are called to be.

But perhaps the Church (which means all our church communities) can try to keep focused on what it is for. The more I go on the more I reflect that this means two things: to state definitely and dauntlessly the reality, nature, and works of God – because otherwise human beings will forget – and to make the point that we can't live the spiritual life alone, because that's where, otherwise, we have a tendency to go. These seem to be the primary things we absolutely need the Church for: they are humble goals which might make us more open to what the Spirit is saying through the people we find hardest to deal with, and which those outside Christian communities might find easier to understand.

Godalming Minster

The Minster Senior Leadership Team continues to meet approximately every two weeks, with current discussion focussed on convolving work on Minster branding with a new vision statement and memorable strapline. This will then move towards the development of a broad implementation plan and communication strategy. Our Parish Needs Plan has been developed with concrete objectives and action plans for three primary strategies to enable the delivery of Christian mission into greater Godalming:

- Intentional Discipleship
- Growing Younger
- Mission and Evangelism through community engagement.

The existing audio/visual system in St Peter and St Paul's Church needs a complete replacement with the latest state of the art equipment and screens.
