Message from the Chair

Friends – There is not space here to tell many stories about the famous Victorian nutcase and Vicar of Morwenstow, Robert Stephen Hawker, except to remark that if half the things reported about him are true we can marvel that he managed to stay in his parish for as long as he did unbothered by the Church authorities. Presumably 19th-century Cornish people just tapped the sides of their noses and said that was what saints were like. I only mention him because he originated the modern form of the Harvest Festival and it's thanks to him that we welcome many people to our churches for special seasonal services this time of the year.

Very few of us has much connection with the original meaning of Harvest, the actual business of producing and gathering food, and some churches therefore focus on other aspects of our lives – the kinds of work that people in our congregations and communities tend to do. We offer some of what we have as a thanksgiving to God, whatever that happens to be – it doesn't have to be marrows and sheaves of wheat anymore.

As individual churches, and as Churches Together, part of our thank-offering to God has been our service to our community, including the annual Christmas Lunch held at the Baptist Church. For many years Maureen Jones has organised the food preparation and kitchen work on the day (in fact most of it gets done on Christmas Eve), but now we're trying to find someone else to fill that role. A couple of weeks ago I spoke to Maureen and now have a good idea of what happens, even to the quantities of food that need to be bought, and Maureen would be glad to answer any questions. It would be ideal for the cook to have a level 2 Food Hygiene Certificate (it can be done online) but at least someone present needs one.

It would be a great shame for this event to stop after so long. Can I encourage everyone to consider the situation prayerfully – and, if you have any brainwaves about what we might do instead to serve members of our community who would otherwise be alone on Christmas Day, perhaps that will be the Spirit speaking to us.

Join us for this weekend retreat in the beautiful surroundings of the Franciscan Centre Ladywell. During these days we will explore what role faith communities have to play in addressing the ecological crisis. We will specifically focus on ecological spirituality. These days will be a mix of input with plenty of time for reflection, time in nature and experiencing various contemplative practices which can help us to cultivate an ecological spirituality, nourish and sustain oneself amid ecological breakdown/discerning a way forward.

Loving the Dust We Are: Exploring Franciscan Ecospirituality

In an age of climate emergency, we are increasingly aware of the threats to the human and more-than-human world. So much of the Christian spiritual tradition has focused not only on human interiority but also human exclusivity in relationship to the divine, reinforcing a distorted image of humanity as over and against and separated from the rest of creation. This day of reflection invites participants to revisit their own sense of creation and our individual and collective place in God's community of creation. Drawing on the profound but often misunderstood Franciscan spiritual tradition, Franciscan friar Prof Daniel Horan will suggest ways that we can renew our sense of cosmic creatureliness while deepening our appreciation for nonhuman creaturely agency, arguing for a Christian spirituality that encourages us to "love the dust we are" and work for justice for all God's creatures.

Fr. Daniel P. Horan, OFM, PhD is Professor of Philosophy, Religious Studies and Theology and Director of the Centre for Spirituality at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Indiana. He is also Affiliated Professor of Spirituality at the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio, Texas. A columnist for the National Catholic Reporter, he is the author or editor of more than fourteen books. His academic research, writing, and teaching focuses on medieval and contemporary spirituality, theological anthropology, Christology, antiracism and LGBTQ issues, and theologies of creation. Prof. Horan regularly lectures around the United States and abroad; and serves on several university, academic, and publication editorial boards. He is recipient of numerous awards for his writing and service and is co-host of The Francis Effect Podcast.
