Message from the Chair

The terrible events in what we refer to as 'the Holy Land' aren't an accident. They come from decades and arguably centuries of bad decisions and misjudgements, not least by we British who, with all our colonial self-confidence, assumed we were best fitted to manage the situation and everyone involved in it.

I'm not going to venture into that matter, but as we all strive to imagine ways out of the violence and pray for better outcomes, there are lessons for other circumstances of conflict too, including those between and maybe within churches. I think perhaps the very first point to come to terms with is that the people who oppose you aren't going to disappear.

This a purely pragmatic and practical consideration: you can't wipe them away, you're going to have to work out a way of living with them somehow. Perhaps in the future they might be in a stronger position than you, so you'd better.

The second step is to decide that you're not going to try to trump your enemy's pain with your own: instead you'll refrain from claiming that it's more important, more valid, or deserving of more sympathy. Thirdly – and this is a step that only people coming from a faith tradition can take – you recognise that absolute, complete justice, like absolute knowledge, only lies beyond this world in the hands of God. Everything that happens to us is secondary. These shifts in the way we think read simply on paper, but are desperately hard to put into practice. Yet as we carry out our Acts of Remembrance over the coming days, perhaps we can bear in mind what moves us on from merely remembering, and towards making things better.

Don't forget the Open Meeting which this time takes place at St Mark's Ockford Ridge at 8.00pm on Wednesday 15 November. We'll be talking about the Minster arrangements and some parallel structures in other parts of the Church.

Fr. Caoimhín Ó Laoide is a Franciscan friar with international experience who has worked in retreat ministry, formation, and in leadership as Provincial and member of the OFM General Council. Fr. Caoimhín Ó Laoide is part of the Franciscan Centre Team based in Ladywell.

Loving the Dust We Are: Exploring Franciscan Ecospirituality

In an age of climate emergency, we are increasingly aware of the threats to the human and more-than-human world. So much of the Christian spiritual tradition has focused not only on human interiority but also human exclusivity in relationship to the divine, reinforcing a distorted image of humanity as over and against and separated from the rest of creation. This day of reflection invites participants to revisit their own sense of creation and our individual and collective place in God's community of creation. Drawing on the profound but often misunderstood Franciscan spiritual tradition, Franciscan friar Prof Daniel Horan will suggest ways that we can renew our sense of cosmic creatureliness while deepening our appreciation for nonhuman creaturely agency, arguing for a Christian spirituality that encourages us to "love the dust we are" and work for justice for all God's creatures.

Fr. Daniel P. Horan, OFM, PhD is Professor of Philosophy, Religious Studies and Theology and Director of the Centre for Spirituality at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Indiana. He is also Affiliated Professor of Spirituality at the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio, Texas. A columnist for the National Catholic Reporter, he is the author or editor of more than fourteen books. His academic research, writing, and teaching focuses on medieval and contemporary spirituality, theological anthropology, Christology, antiracism and LGBTQ issues, and theologies of creation. Prof. Horan regularly lectures around the United States and abroad; and serves on several university, academic, and publication editorial boards. He is recipient of numerous awards for his writing and service and is co-host of The Francis Effect Podcast.
