Message from the Chair

I think myself fortunate to have managed to keep some non-Christian friends over the course of the years who often allow me a different perspective on things from what I'd find otherwise. The other day I was at a birthday picnic for a friend who follows a pagan tradition, and she told me about a disagreement that had broken out in the particular group she interacts with (online, at any rate). A leading figure in this world had caused some controversy by arguing that some of the festivals people observe don't really date back to ancient Celtic times but have essentially been made up in the last few decades. Pagans of all sorts place great importance on human beings' relationship with nature and the 'cycle of the year', so for them this is a hot issue.

On the one hand I could see that in spiritual traditions of all kinds there will always be people who want to systematise and categorise, even among pagans who take especial pride in everyone 'following their own path' rather than having an overarching authority laying down the law about what they should or shouldn't do. On the other, the whole point of religion is giving yourself over to something bigger than yourself, and that means having stable spiritual beliefs and practices which shape and interpret your life, rather than making it up as you go along.

Although modern paganism claims very old antecedents, in its current form it's a pretty young religious tradition, whereas Christianity is very old. Some of our spiritual practices (even in denominations whose origin is relatively recent) represent two thousand years of meditation on, and experience of, the mystery of God's saving work in Christ. But once upon a time we were working things out as well, combining the teachings and memories of Jesus, the first Christian communities were able to pass on with their Jewish heritage and ideas from the Graeco-Roman society which they were growing within. We prayed for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, which is just what we need as we learn from each other now, and discern the difference between what's human and what's genuinely of God.

Having completed his curacy with Godalming Minster, we delighted to announce that Patrick Samuels has agreed to be Vicar of the new Benefice of Horton, Wraybury and Colnbrook in the Buckingham Archdeaconry of Oxford Diocese.

Sheila Samuels, Associate Minister will go to Buckingham with Patrick, leaving her position at St Mark's Franklyn Road, with her last Sunday being 1 September. The clergy team and Franklyn Road congregation are already making plans for life after Sheila, aiming to ensure services and mission activities continue. Please pray for Patrick and Sheila and their family as they prepare to move, and give thanks for their ministry over the past few years in Godalming.

At the request of the PCC, The Bishop of Guildford has extended John Harkin's existing contract (3 days per week) for up to a year, whilst John and Sue continue to work with the Church of England to find a suitable retirement property. John will continue ministry to the Church Street congregations in addition to supporting ministry in Hambledon. The post of Associate Minister to live in Hambledon will be advertised shortly. Congratulations to David Brockman for being accepted by the Diocese to become a Locally Licensed Minster (LLM).

Repairs to Busbridge Church tower

The urgent repairs to the to the Busbridge Church tower are progressing well, though the costs are considerably higher than expected. We are therefore aiming to raise what we can towards the c £70,000.

Therefore, the PCC is applying for grants, there is an appeal to members of the congregations, local residents and a day of prayer was held on 10 June 2024.
