Message from the Chair

Through September several church communities will be observing the 'Season of Creation'. This is a relatively new liturgical observance which has taken hold in the last couple of decades. Late September and early October were traditionally kept as Harvest – at Farncombe our Harvest Festival is always on the first Sunday in October – even though across the UK the 'harvest', agriculturally speaking, is mostly in long before we reach this point. In 1989 the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew set aside September 1st as a Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation to be observed by Orthodox Christians, opening up the idea of a special season of Creation between then and the Feast of St Francis of Assisi on October 4th, thus fitting in well with the old observance of Harvest (at least in Europe).

No matter what Christian community we belong to or which brand of theology we follow, we all share one planet. We often talk about 'the environment' as though it was something separate from human beings, and 'stewardship of creation' as though it was something nice and virtuous which we should be congratulated for but not really necessary. The truth is that it's our very existence: our food, energy, and shelter. We can't manage without it, and we are part of it.

A couple of years ago I attended a conference about faith and climate change at Surrey University where a rabbi who was an activist with Extinction Rebellion basically told us that within a century society would collapse, most human beings would die, we should all get used to it, and the role of religion in this business is to express grief and mourning. It wasn't very encouraging to say the least. Long-term damage to the created order does indeed threaten human survival (though the scientists are not sure how far down this road we've gone) – but as well as thinking about and stressing human responsibility for the creation God has given us to look after, the task of Christians is to remind everyone (including ourselves) that, no matter what happens, the Lord reigns, his purposes advance, and our ultimate hope is to discern and align ourselves with his everlasting will.

Sylvia lived out a life of Christian love and commitment both in our church, the town, the wider Methodist circuit and in our struggling world - through the charitable work she shared with her husband Ryan.

Back in the 1970s, she grappled with the task of creating Godalming United Church from the merger of the two neighbouring churches on either side of the river, and for many years she was our Church Secretary. She was involved with both older folk and children, and an authority on Safeguarding. The Kelleys' links with West Africa led to an especially close relationship with Grace and Daniel Pratt Morris Chapman who were always welcome at their home with their growing family when on leave from their missionary work.

Pope Francis' prayer intention for September is that each of us listen with our hearts to the cry of the Earth and of the victims of environmental disasters and the climate crisis, making a personal commitment to care for the world we inhabit.

The Season of Creation

During September we celebrate this season, which starts with a World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation on 1 September, and continues through until 4 October, the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi. This year's theme is 'To Hope and Act with Creation'. Over the weekend of 14 and 15 September, at our Season of Creation Masses, our Live Simply group will be asking people to reflect, and write down on a hexagon shape, their thoughts in response to two questions: how are we living more simply? What else could we do to live more simply?

It is hoped that the hexagons will create an amazing patchwork display of actions and suggestions for the parish to reflect on.
