Message from the Chair

One of the books I'm trying to find my way through at the moment is *The Enduring Melody* by Michael Mayne, the former Dean of Westminster Abbey. It describes his journey through treatment for cancer and eventually his terminal diagnosis, reflecting on what faith means in the face of illness. It's a moving and valuable book. But at one point Michael Mayne describes attending a church service (when he is able to) and expresses the impatience he's begun to feel at this stage in his life with sermons that focus on personal sinfulness to the neglect of social sins – conflict, neglect of the poor, racism and so on.

Perhaps in a basically well-off society, and in a particularly well-off corner of it, we have a tendency to focus on our internal spiritual states rather than anything more socially challenging. Our churches often offer events that tackle negative thoughts and feelings, but is this a little self-absorbed? Should we look more broadly at those bigger social issues? My view is that there's a connection between them. Our own individual pains, sins, and unacknowledged damage are exactly the root of those bigger problems, and dealing with them is a vital part of the work of tackling the sins and failings that afflict human society on the corporate level. There's no contradiction.

I always think of the remark of the Orthodox saint and martyr Mother Maria Skobtsova that 'the test of the liturgy inside the church is the liturgy outside it', that is, the quality of our worship is proved by what we do in the rest of our lives. When we succeed in holding both together, our church communities do the work that God wants of us.
