Message from the Chair

At the Open Meeting last month (as described below) the select group of us present talked about how our various churches serve the wider community at Christmas. But we also found ourselves discussing the different initiatives that run all the year round to improve people's welfare in both practical and non-material ways. It was a natural way for the conversation to develop: after all there's no reason why what happens at Christmas, if it's truly worthwhile, shouldn't happen at other times too. The needs are just the same, and they remain no matter what time of the year it is. The only exceptions, perhaps, are for situations people find themselves in that are more acute in the winter, such as rough sleeping; we might indeed think more about those at Christmas merely because it tends to be cold.

But really our minds turn particularly to this kind of community service at Christmas because the message of the Incarnation of Christ throws need into particular relief. God becomes human, and, more than that, becomes a poor and marginalised human with only temporary shelter, born into danger and threat, and this reminds us forcibly of the needs around us in a way we can't ignore if we're paying any attention at all to the narrative. Of course there are secular motivations too – if Christmas is a time when people get together and celebrate, at least partly involving the spending of a lot of money, it seems all the more wrong that some should suffer from loneliness or inequality at this time. But the Christian message adds urgency and a cosmic significance to those basic ideas.

We know that need isn't only for Christmas, and neither is service, but our reflections, hopes and acts can and should inform what we try to do for the rest of the year as well.

Churches Together news and events

Open Meeting, 15 November

Our Open Meeting on 15 November followed lunch at the United Church. We opened our discussion by talking about the Christmas Lunch. This is well-publicised and supported, but take-up has been declining over the last decade, possibly accelerated by the pandemic. This raises the question of whether it's the best way of serving our community at Christmas (of course our churches aim at serving the locality all year, but it seems especially important at Christmas that people are not left out of festivity and celebration). Also, the Anglican Deanery Synod had just been examining deprivation statistics for the local parishes which was interesting in terms of revealing patterns of (for instance) social housing and land use, even within a district which is prosperous overall.

It was appropriate that we'd just taken part in the weekly lunch at GUC. This is an inexpensive meal provided by one of four teams who take a turn each month. There were about a dozento-fifteen customers today, which was a good turnout, according to Gwen.

We discussed various elements of community service in our own church communities, not

necessarily only focused on material needs but also issues such as loneliness and grief. Angela described the work of the St Vincent de Paul Society in the RC parish, which organises social and pastoral work ranging from supplying items of furniture for Ukrainian refugees to arranging lifts to appointments for people undergoing medical treatment, and providing phone cards. Margot mentioned the Bereavement Café at Busbridge, and James described the Hearing Aid clinic and *Kettle's on* at Farncombe.

We were aware that there was potentially need of various kinds in the area but which we might not know about. The existence of the Food Bank and Community Store demonstrated that. James mentioned an occasion some years ago when he and Maggie Stirling Troy had had contact with people who struggled with literacy, but had moved no further than discussing the issue. Occasionally a visit in connection with an occasional office revealed a household in some need, but this was decreasing in frequency as the Church conducts fewer funerals and baptisms. We forgot to mention the fact that the Henry Smith Trust has now moved away from distributing its annual surplus at Christmas through the churches, and was now dividing it between Loseley Fields and All Saints Schools, as the schools were in a better position to assess material need in families; the churches would encounter it in a random rather than a systematic way.
